To secure a Professional Growth Certificate for the 2023-2024 school year, you should read the five issues of the Journal of Adventist Education, at least one book from Group B, and at least four additional books from two or more other headings. Some books may have been listed under two headings and will count for either group. One book of your choice, which could be classified under any of these headings, may be substituted for a book on this list.

GROUP A - READER'S CHOICE

Baptizing the Devil: Evolution and the Seduction of Christianity

Cliff Goldstein's book focuses on the ancient battle between evolution and biblical creation, but with a novel twist. He takes the position with supporting documentation from the Bible and science that the biblical account is far superior, and that Christians don't have to hide behind the adage, "it (evolution) must be true because it's science". Further, his persuasive argument goes against those Christians who seek compromise by trying "to harmonize evolution and the Bible" from which the captivating title, *Baptizing the Devil* is based. With a wealth of strong documentary argument from world history, notable science, the great works of philosophy, music, art psychology, the Bible and much, much more, Goldstein's monumental work crushes evolutionary thought in full support of God's magnificent universal creation.

Equity in Data: A Framework for What Counts in Schools

Teachers and many administrators' eyes often tend to "glaze over" when the conversation goes toward data, data mining, and now data equity. This book, however, offers some hope that this important topic can be seen in new light. Instead of loading up on a ton of numbers, percentages, and difficult to understand statistics, the authors are quick to share how data is more than facts, numbers, statistics, and percentages. It's about people, their stories, feelings, perspectives, and experiences. With a plethora of charts, graphs, and indexes, templates, discussion generators, and action steps the authors share how school leaders can use data principles, tools, and best practices for creating an equitable data culture.

Habits of the Heart: Biblical Principles for Growing Christians

With a notable history for writing children's books, Ken Crawford turns his attention in this book toward those seeking help for strengthening spirituality. It is designed to provide a nurturing guide for developing and expanding the influence of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Christian. The structure of the book is notable with three easy to follow sections focused on fulfilling the kingdom of God in our lives. The final section contains practical experiences for sharing the ongoing story of God's leading in our lives. Crawford makes the strong point that the purpose of the book goes beyond helping the individual become stronger spiritually. The real benefit is that the living testimony of a renewed life and Christian journey leaves "footprints that others can follow".

For this book, it includes 365 of the more than 840 in all. A casual scan of the many names of Jesus gives one the impression that this is the inspired writing of a person with an up close, personal relationship with the Savior. The names used just for the month of January including, Alpha and Omega, Burden Bearer, Living Vine, Tried Stone, etc. provide



insight to this powerful book about our loving Savior. Its overall purpose is to introduce Jesus to those who have never known him and his love for us and to be an enriching support to those who seek strength in their continuing walk with Him.

Jesus Unleased: A New Vision of the Bold Confrontations of Christ and Why They Matter

The common theme throughout his journey is open, honest, and fervent prayer, not focused always on the problem, the sin or the resolution of the physical need, but on God and his promises and his gifts of life for us. Prayer and faith do not change God, according to the authors, but it changes us, transforming our lives from selfishness to self-sacrifice and total witness to the world. This is a compelling book, a must read to learn about the true meaning and power of prayer.

Living With the Mind of Jesus: How Beliefs Shape Your Worldview

This book opens with an impressive metaphor of how "a broken camper level", impacts what and how one's worldview can negatively affect one's attitude, communication, and relationships. In life, when the worldview lens (camper level) is broken or disrupted, the worldview is disrupted as well. The authors present relatively easy to understand, readable examples for understanding the often-times difficult concept of worldview which they define as "the individual's collection of beliefs about life, death and the world". More specifically, the authors propose that a biblical worldview provides scriptural-based, God-centered, information about the big philosophical questions of life, truth, reality, metaphysics, and epistemology. With examples from their personal lives and ministry and with supporting scriptural documentation, they contend that a biblical worldview is superior to a humanistic worldview and that knowing God directs our understanding of everything else.

Make Your Voice Heard in Heaven: How to Pray with Power

In this book, Black turns his attention to what many believe is the "secret sauce" of his

He structures each chapter of the book around the fifteen points of reference for his prayers and with hundreds of supporting biblical texts, including the "model prayer in Matthew 6, he teaches us how to pray with power. This is a "must" read for every person who desires a stronger prayer life.... whether a believer or not.

Prophecy's Answer to Philosophy's Confusion: Looking at the Existence of God with New Eyes

In his book, Boyd Bailey focuses his argument for good leadership on development of bible-based character traits. These are those found in the in Galatians 5 and labeled by the Apostle Paul as the Fruits of the Spirit. They include love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Every good leader works to exhibit all or most of these character traits according to Bailey, or they are honest in acknowledging weaknesses. Finally, good leaders are quick to display active work to courageously meet these character traits. Bailey goes on to focus remaining chapters in his book toward an honest, bible-based appraisal of each of the fruit characteristics with anecdotal evidence of his own experience and testimonials from noted spiritual leaders. Particular focus is found in the practical application in real life situations of the results of such a spirit-filled life.

Hearts of Faith: How We Became Seventh-day Adventists

This book tells, with historical precision and literary artistry, the story of the organization of the Seventh-day Adventist church. The author relates the history with snapshots of the strong emotions felt by the early pioneers as they experienced the weeping of the great disappointment of 1844. He traces with biblical documentation and with the inspirational guidance of Ellen White how the leaders moved beyond the emotions of the disappointment. These factors plus the tremendous growth and spread of the nescient group helped to formalize the early church complete with a formal constitution and structure of conferences and higher-level organizations. It's a fascinating and absorbing view of how the Millerites became Sabbatarians and ultimately, Seventh-day Adventists.

Genesis And Science: Where is the Evidence Going

In this book, Brand takes on the daunting task of reconciling the Bible and science. Much of the research most of which was completed prior to the 1970's is based on



archeological observations of forests and digs throughout the world, which shows that the earth appears to be much older than the biblical record. This view has contributed to the notion that science and the Bible cannot be reconciled. Brand takes a different view in this book based on more recent research competed after the Mt. St. Helena eruption in the 1980's. Armed with results from the new research as well as an updated worldview, Brand contradicts the earlier results and acknowledges that the Bible and science can be reconciled. Beyond the archeological and scientific progress, he makes a strong argument that his research reaffirms the belief that the Bible is still the most reliable and truth-filled testimony supporting creation.

The Effective Facilitator's Handbook: Leading Teacher Workshops, Committees, Teams, and Study Groups

This is the third edition of this popular book based on the authors' vision for the need to translate best-available research into a manageable set of highly effective practices for teachers. The authors have made best use of feedback from professional teachers and researchers about how well the original version improved classroom teaching as well as some weaknesses. The updated version incorporates much of what was learned from the original version along with improved research emphasizing student diversity, equity, and inclusion. The original 14 instructional strategies have remained presenting a very readable, research-based manual for improving instruction.

Fostering Resilient Learners: Strategies for Creating a Trauma-Sensitive Classroom

With backgrounds and experience in youth counseling, the authors have sought to enlighten educators to the real-life world of acute childhood traumas, (ACDs). They point out with documented research focusing on what trauma is, how to understand its origins, its prevalence and that it is not ok in today's classrooms. Focusing on facts documenting that not all trauma is based on poverty, or racial identity, the authors share how such ACD's have become endemic to our high stress, computer oriented, gun-loving, society. The book makes strong effort to show how time-honored, but simple gestures like praise, love, laughter, eliminating fear, and building strong relationships can counteract the negative impact of trauma leading to academic success for all students.

I Notice: A Step-By-Step Guide to Transform Student Potential Through Building Intentional Relationships

Claire E. Hallinan, with a strong background as a teacher makes use of a relatively new technique for improving student performance. Instead of blaming the students for poor performance, Hallinan uses "I Notice" statements focused first on the teacher's perspective on the problem. This approach plus an emphasis on building effective relationships with students presents an intelligent, nonjudgmental teaching style for improving student performance. Her approach utilizes other student-friendly techniques as standing in the door each day as a way to physically welcome students to class. She also advocates journaling as a way to keep track of the mental as well as the physical attributes of the classroom, including the sounds.

The Mastery Learning Handbook: A Competency-Based Approach to Student Achievement

Johnathan Bergmann, ASCD, 2023, 154 pages

This book, unlike many on the current market, takes the philosophical and theoretical aspects of Mastery Learning, and puts it in the practical, real-life world of the average classroom teacher. With an abundance of charts, graphs, figures and references, the



books provide an easily referenced way to understand and practice this technique for improving student performance. Using some of the techniques learned during the Covid pandemic, Bergmann starts with the classic approach of flipping the classroom. That is instead of standing in front of the class lecturing, the students watched prerecorded lectures at home and worked on live problem-solving projects during class. This approach led to well documented improvements in achievement and set the stage for the mastery learning level which focused on classroom instruction that empowered every student to progress with confidence.

Total Participation Techniques: Making Every Student an Active Learner, 2nd Edition

The authors make a strong point with this second edition of their earlier work about TPT's (Total Participation Techniques). Defining a TPT as a teaching technique that allows all students to demonstrate active participation and cognitive development at the same time, the Himmeles believe that such techniques lead to stronger classroom learning and better teaching. The book cites notable research in several states, along with citations from teachers who have had success with the technique. The reader will also find an abundance of techniques and application of TPT strategies throughout the book.
